HISTORY

1984

- First HIV case in Chile

1990

- CONASIDA (National AIDS Corporation) is created
- Testing for HIV in blood donors
- Vertical transmission prevention protocol is implemented

1997

- Chile and UNAIDS work together to improve treatment access

2001

- Law 19.779 ("The AIDS Law") on discrimination and access is promulgated

2003

- Chile increases coverage of ART to 100% in the public sector



In 2016, Chile had 5000 new HIV infections; 9000 estimated in 2019

There were 61000 people living with HIV, among whom 53% were accessing ART

Among pregnant women living with HIV, 38% were accessing treatment or prophylaxis to prevent transmission of HIV to their children

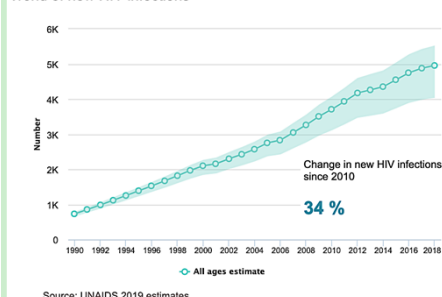
An estimated 90 children were newly infected with HIV due to mother-to-child transmission

Among people living with HIV, 48% had suppressed viral loads

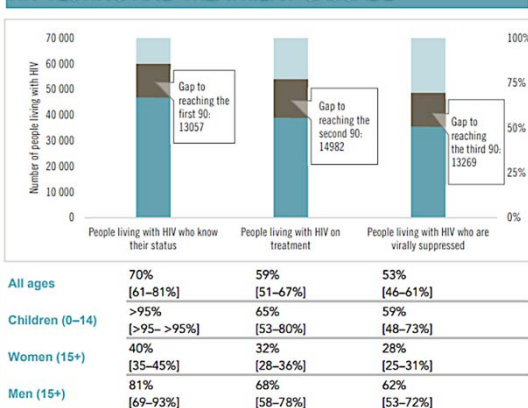


Since 2010, new HIV infections have increased by 35% and AIDS-related deaths have increased by 34%
