

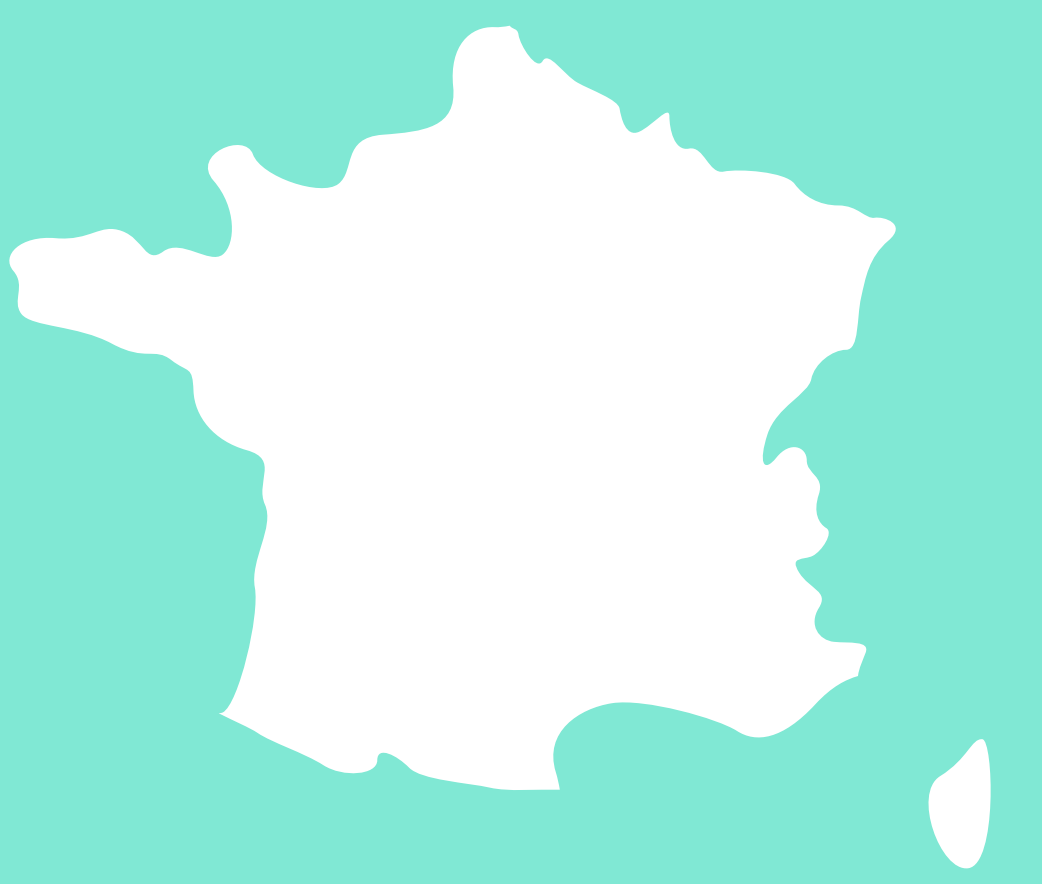

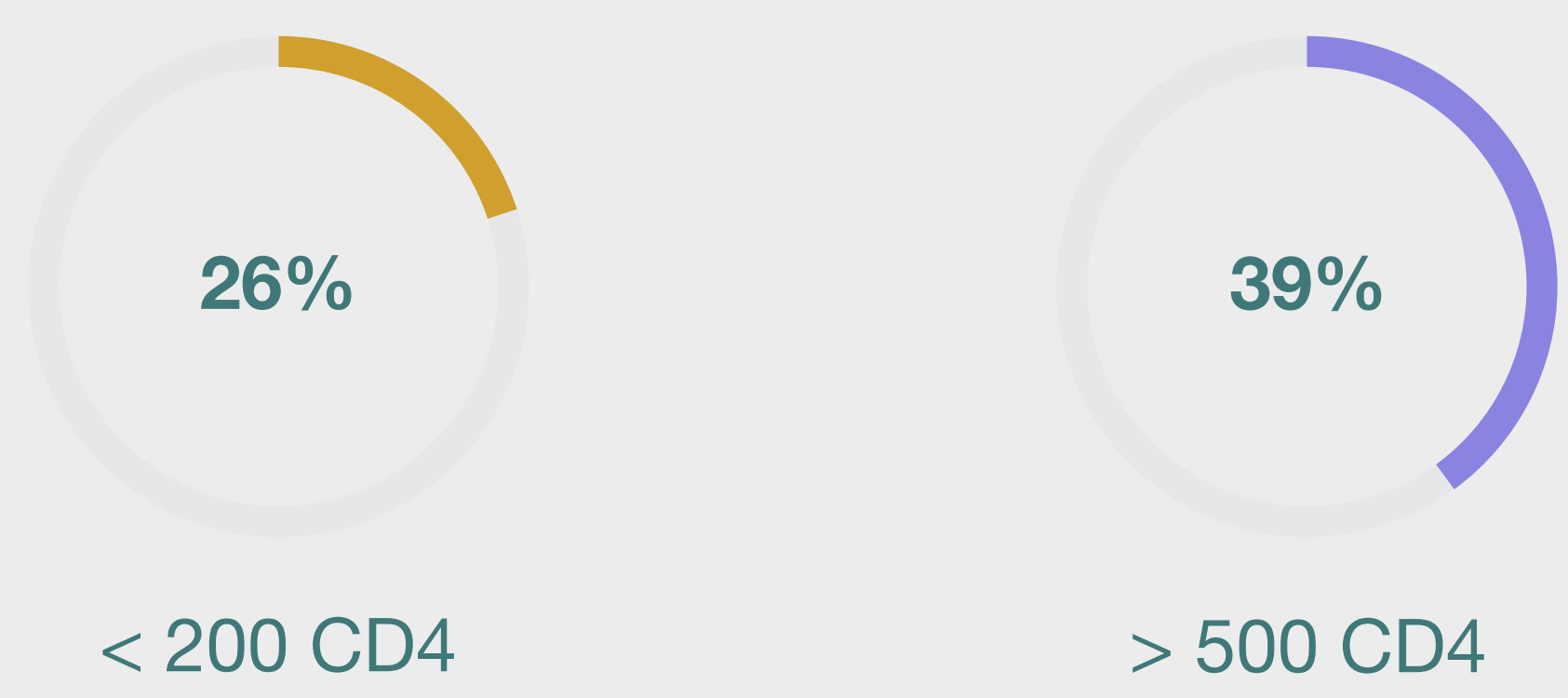
1. EPIDEMIOLOGY IN FRANCE

NEW CONTAMINATIONS

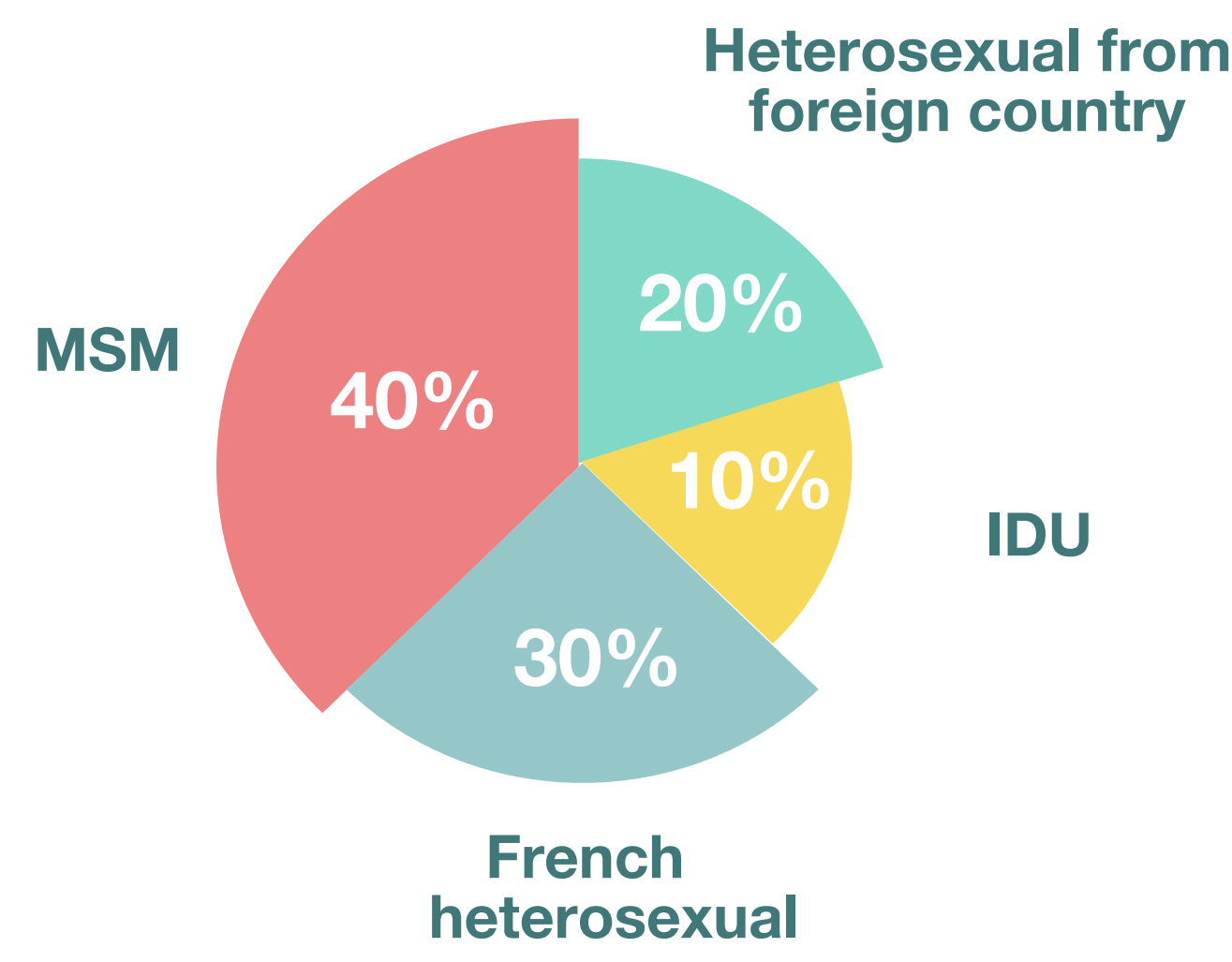
20% at least 50 years old

70% MALE

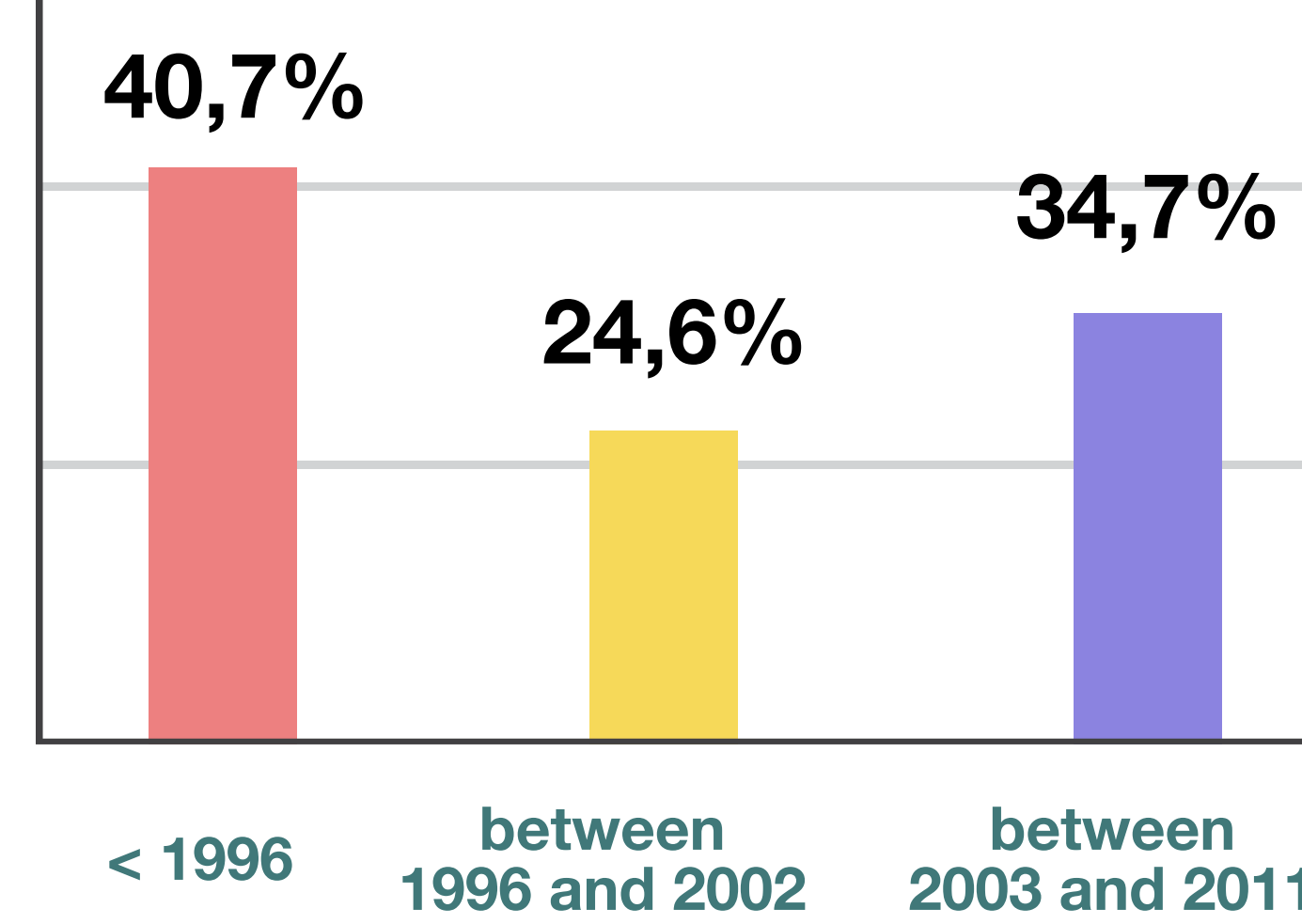


30% FEMALE

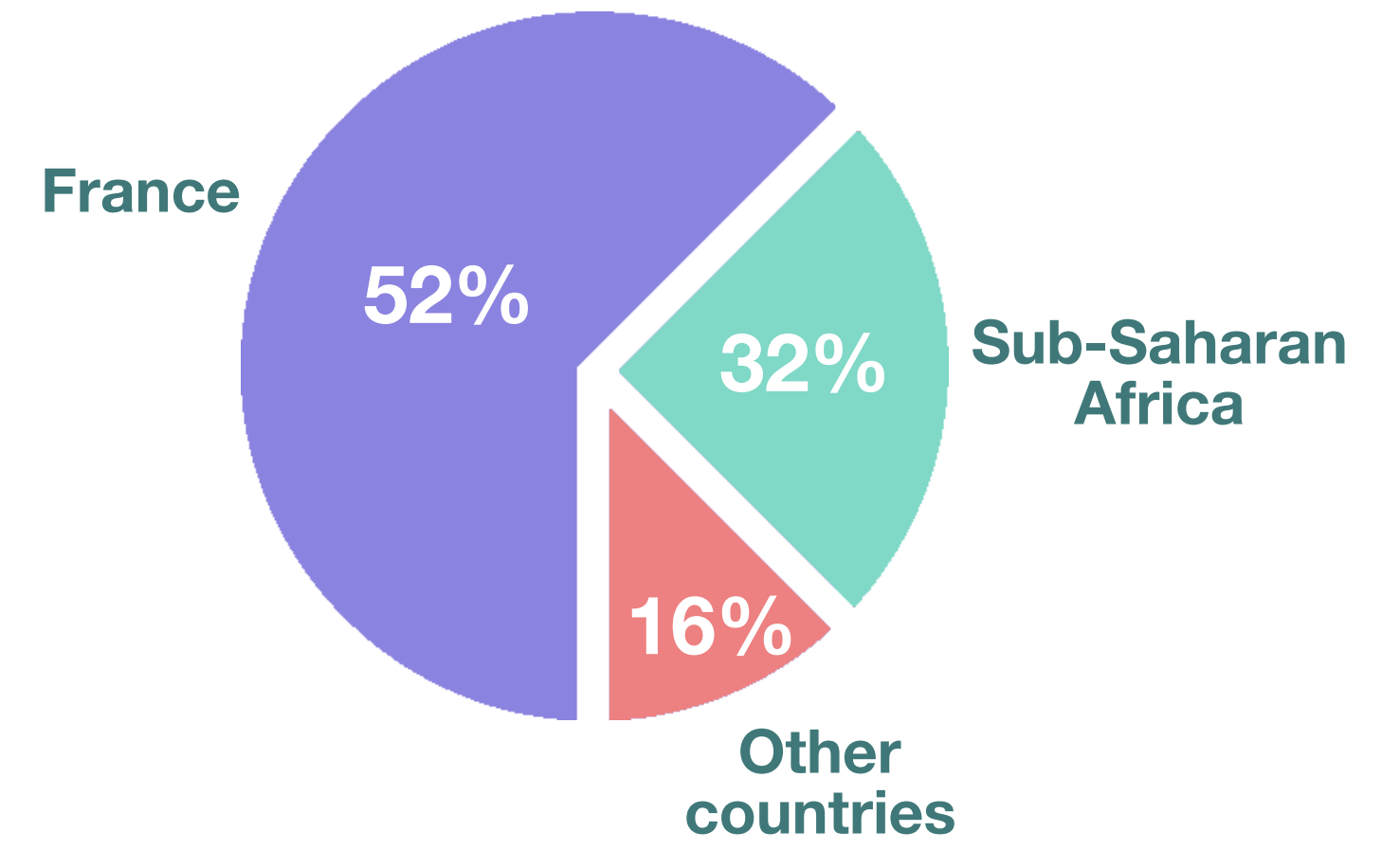
70% covered by public health insurance system

COUNTRY OF ORIGIN

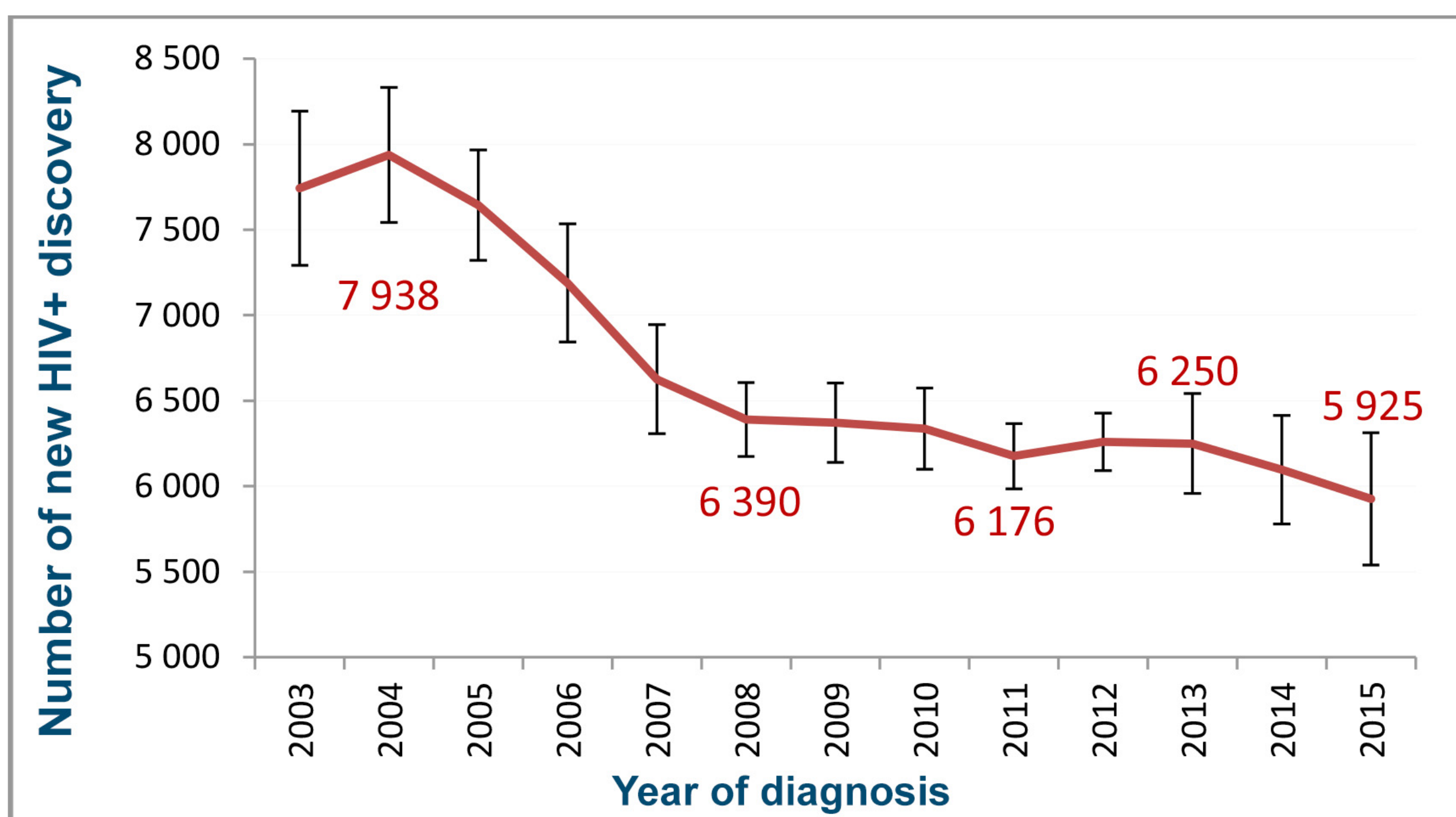

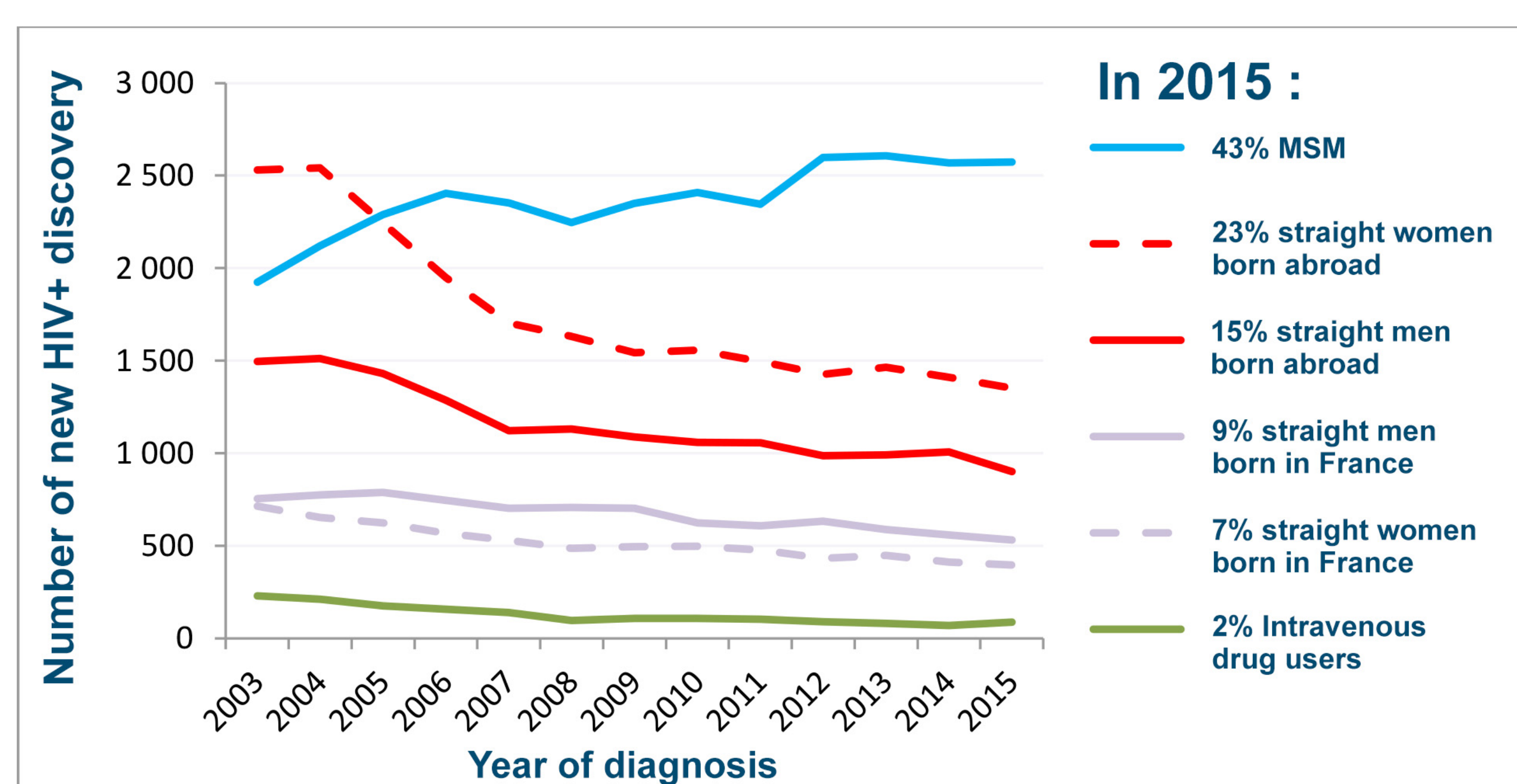

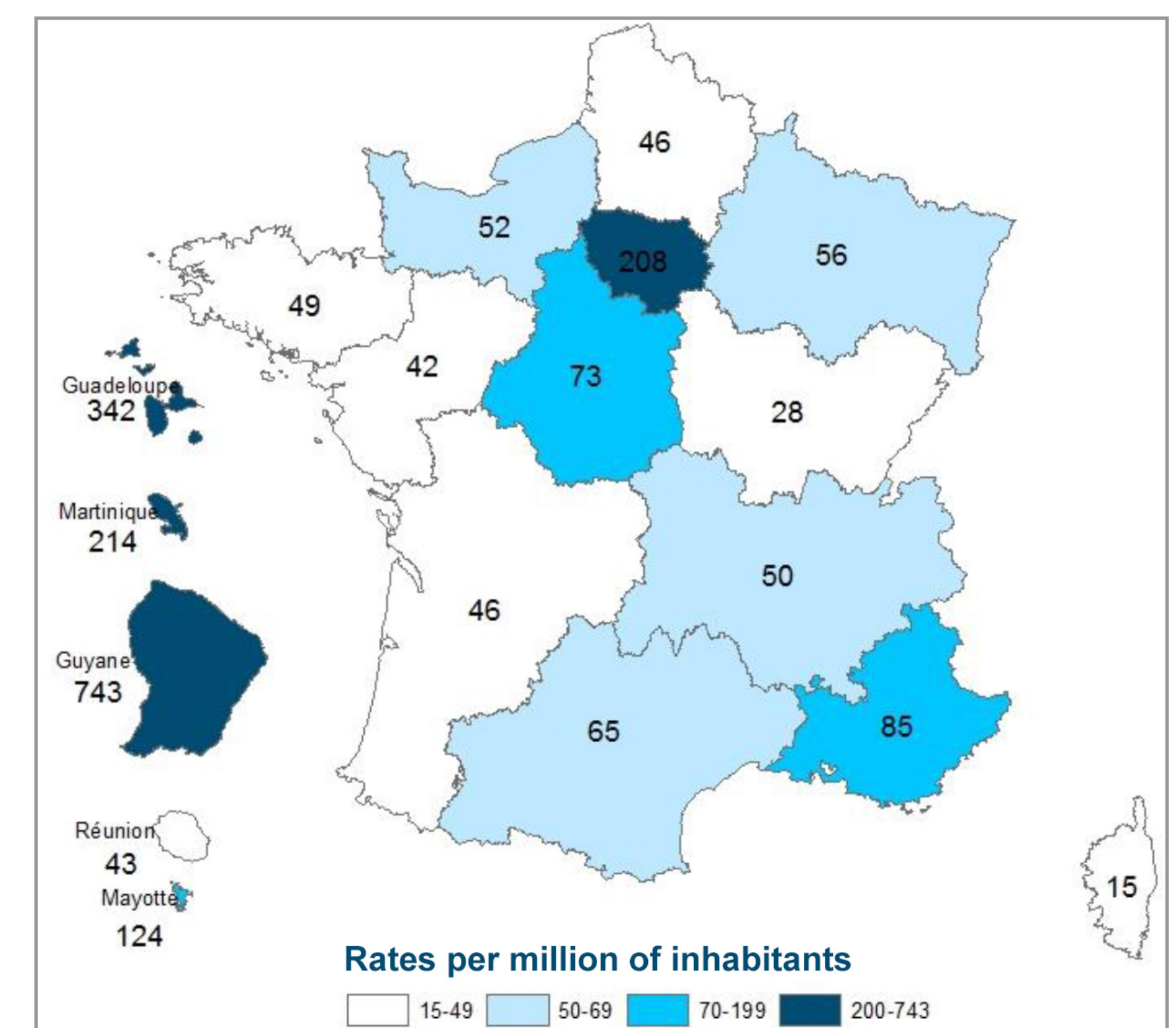

3. MAIN ISSUE STOP THE EPIDEMIC

PREPCARE ORGANISATION

- First consultation**
 - Education on HIV and other STDs
 - Information on PrEP
 - Update of vaccines if necessary
 - Prescription of the initial biology tests
- Second consultation**
 - Answer questions that could have emerge since the first encounter
 - Explanation of the lab results
 - Initial physical exam
 - Vaccination against HAV and HBV if nonimmunized
 - Initiation prescription of TDF/FTC
 - Counselling interview with an educator from AIDES association who will check the understanding and complete the education on HIV, PrEP and STDs
- Follow-up consultations**
 - Every 3 months
 - Lab testing for STDs and TDF/FTC tolerance

SCREENING

- Free and anonymous screening consultation centres
- Screening of every person at least once in his life
- New law in 2016 allows screening of underage person without the mandatory consent of his parents or legal tutor

PREVENTION TOOLS

PROTECTION

- Condoms
- PrEP use

TASP

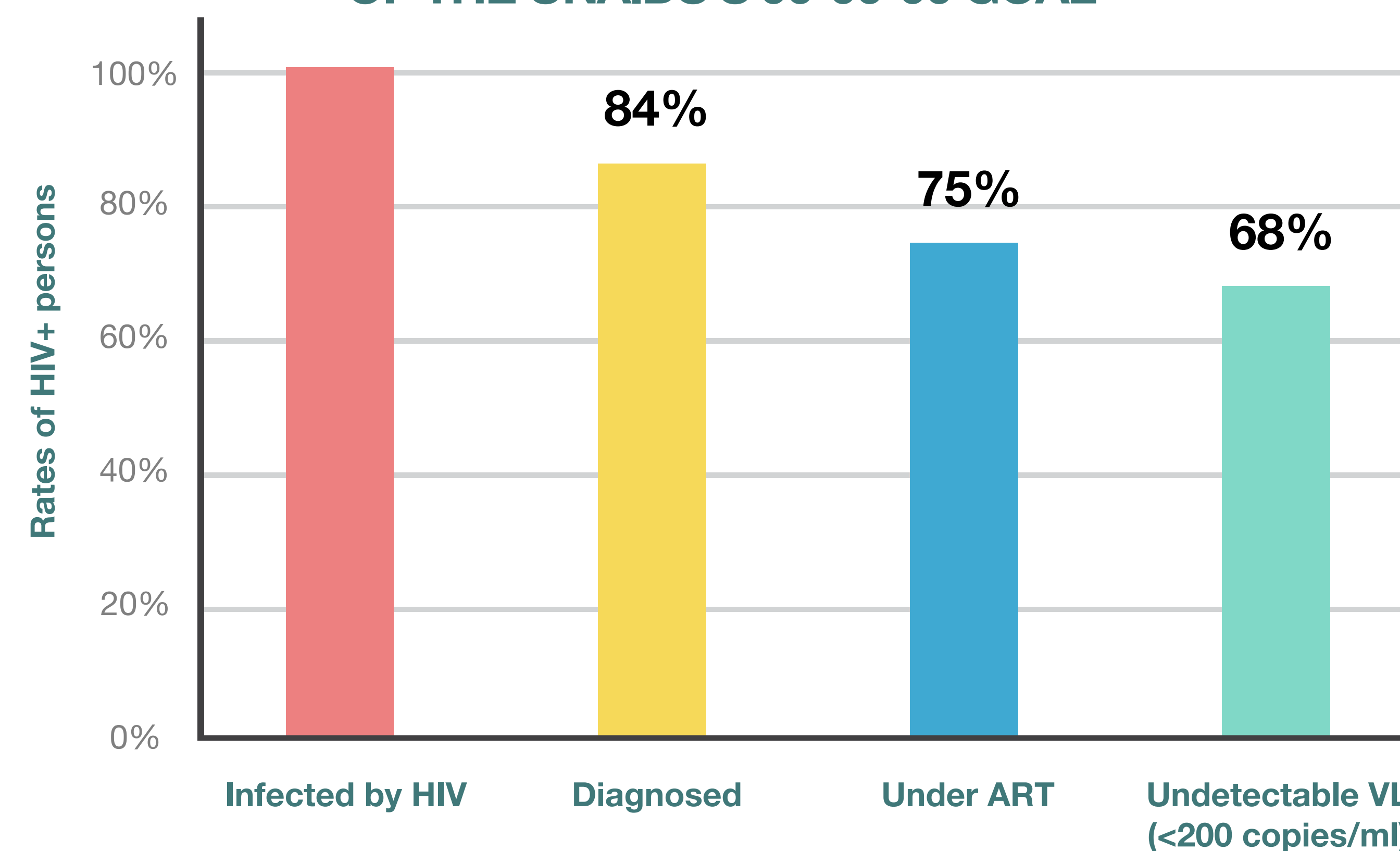
- Treat every one regardless of their CD4 level since 2013

POST-EXPOSURE TREATMENT

- Free and available in every Emergency room
- Introduced in the first 48 hours following the risk exposure

World AIDS DAY

PARIS FIGHTS MORE THAN EVER AGAINST AIDS



1.147M€ of subsidies to associations in 2016 +15% in comparison with 2015



+ 1.5M condoms freely given each year



11 centers for free HIV screening and information



11 locations for PrEP consultations for more than 120 opening hours per week



125 beds to welcome HIV+ patients in need of socio-medical follow-up
