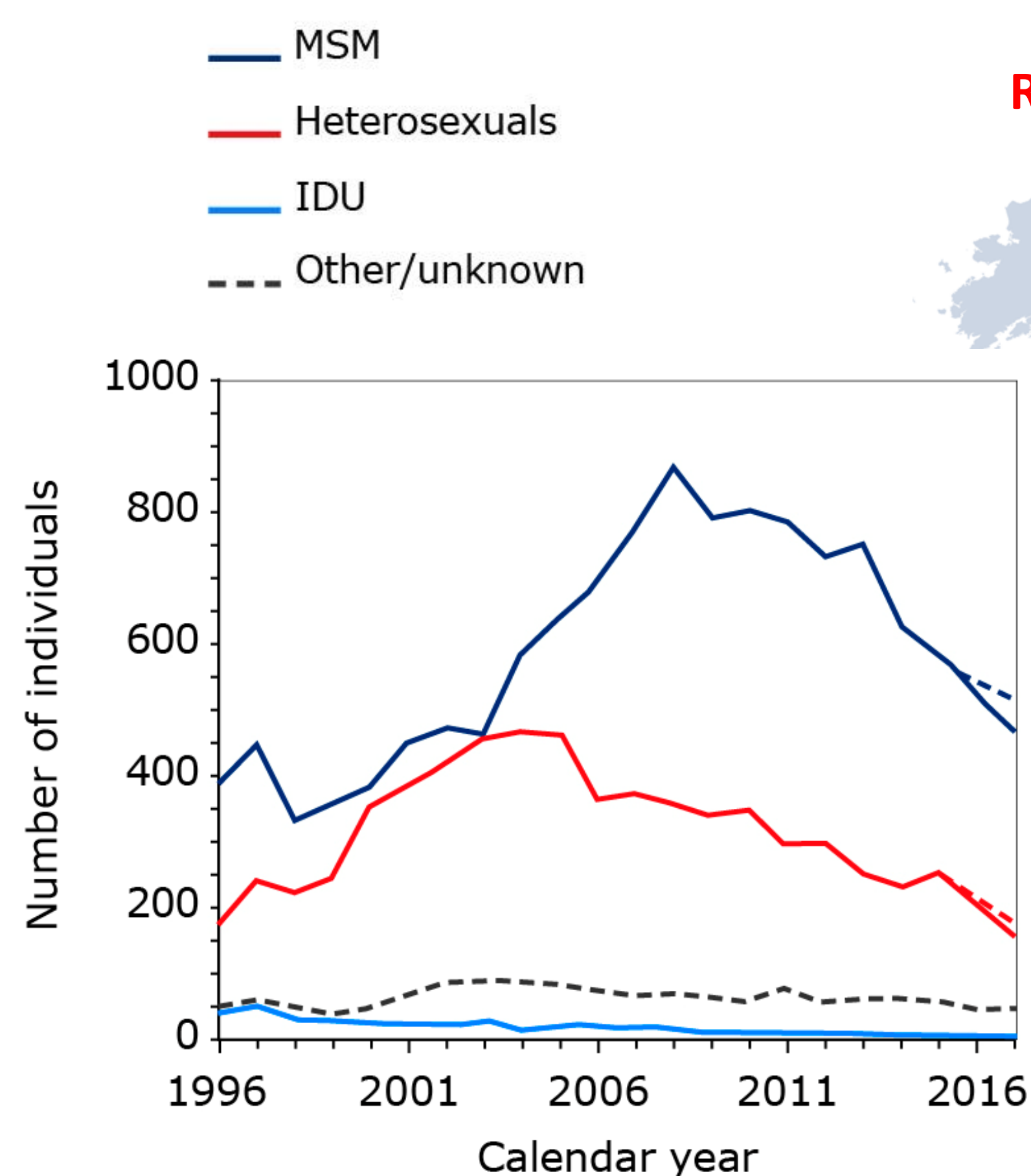


Figure 1: Annual new HIV diagnosis in the Netherlands (population of 17 million people); per mode of transmission

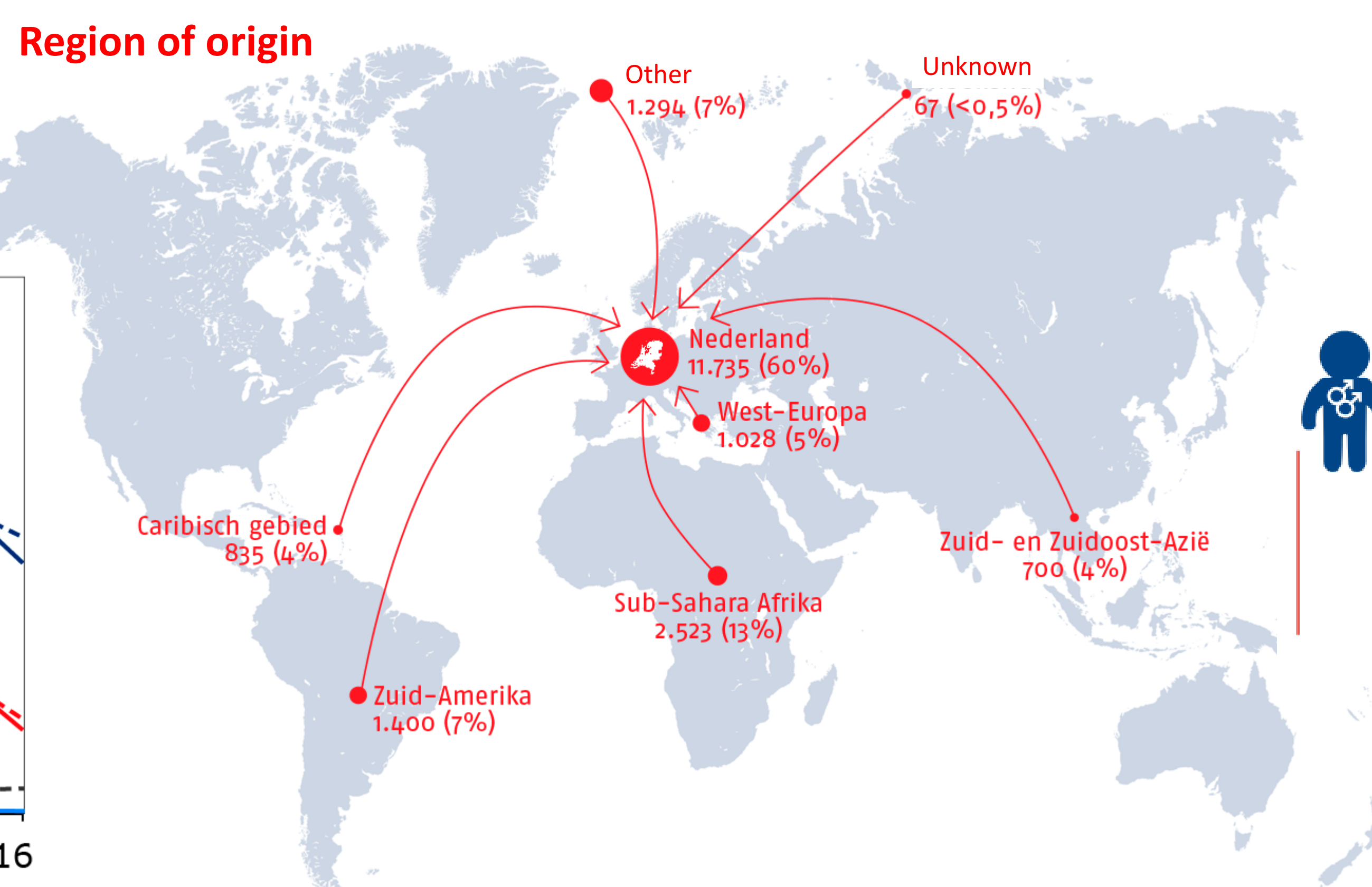


Figure 2: HIV in the Netherlands; region of origin

19,582 people with HIV and in care per 31 December 2017

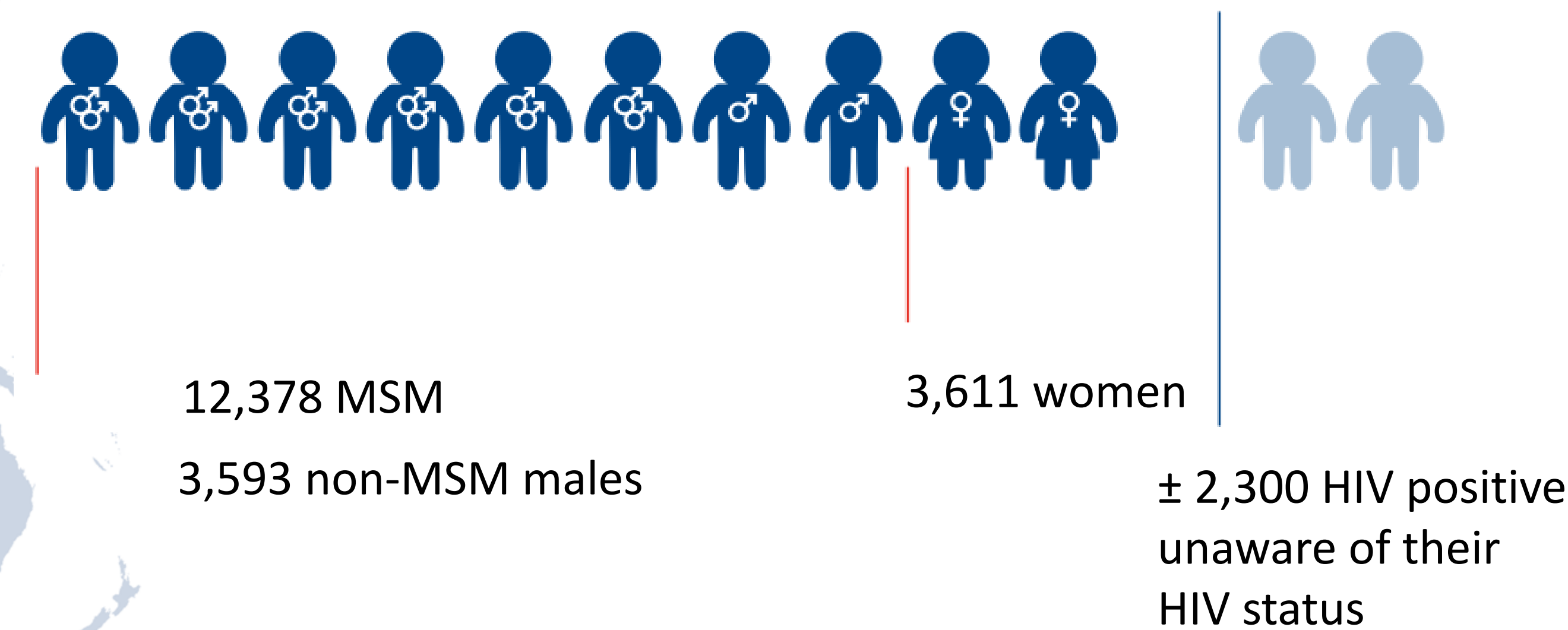


Figure 3: people living with HIV and in care in 2017

Figure 4: Cascade of HIV care for the Netherlands in 2017

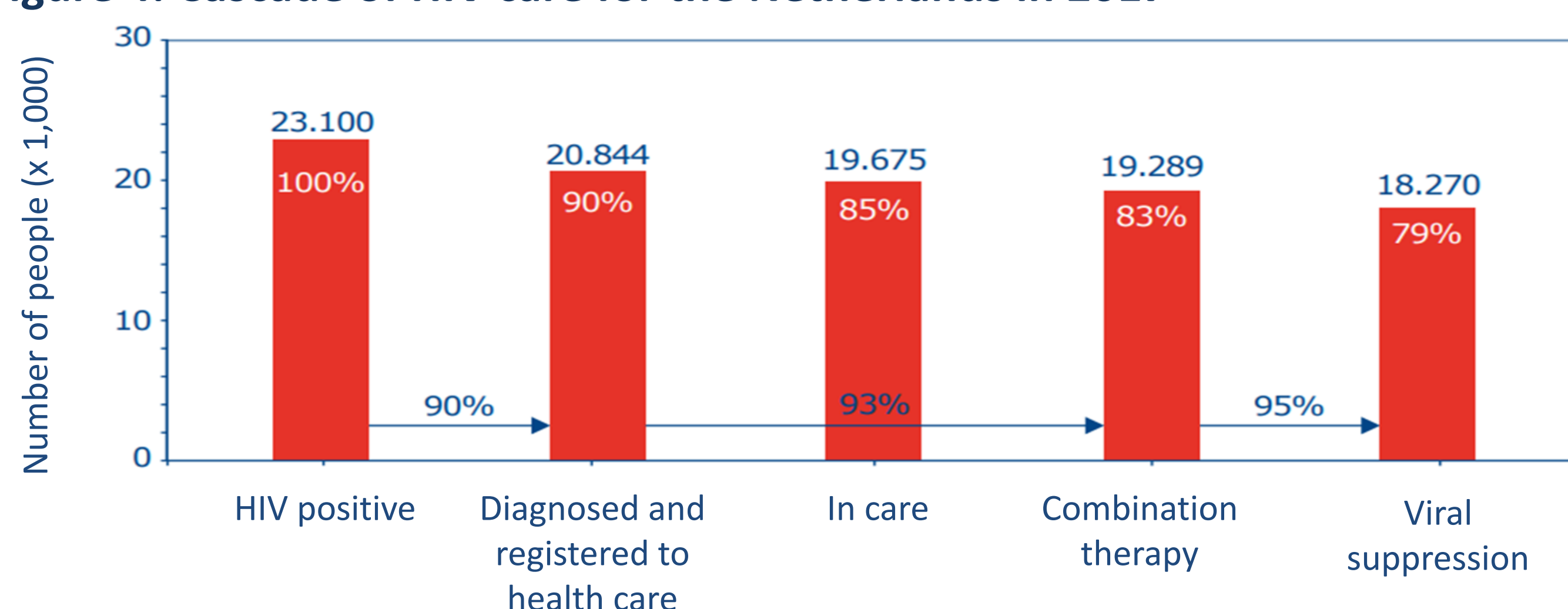


Figure 5: Time between diagnosis and start cART.

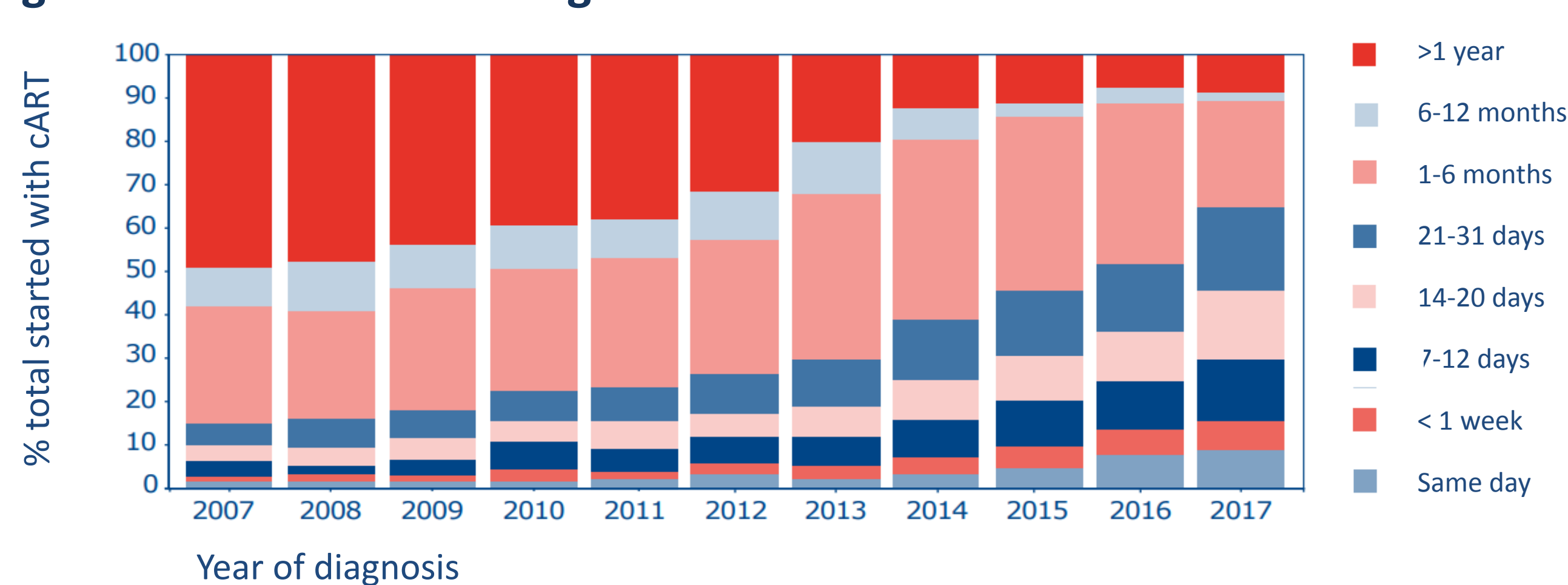
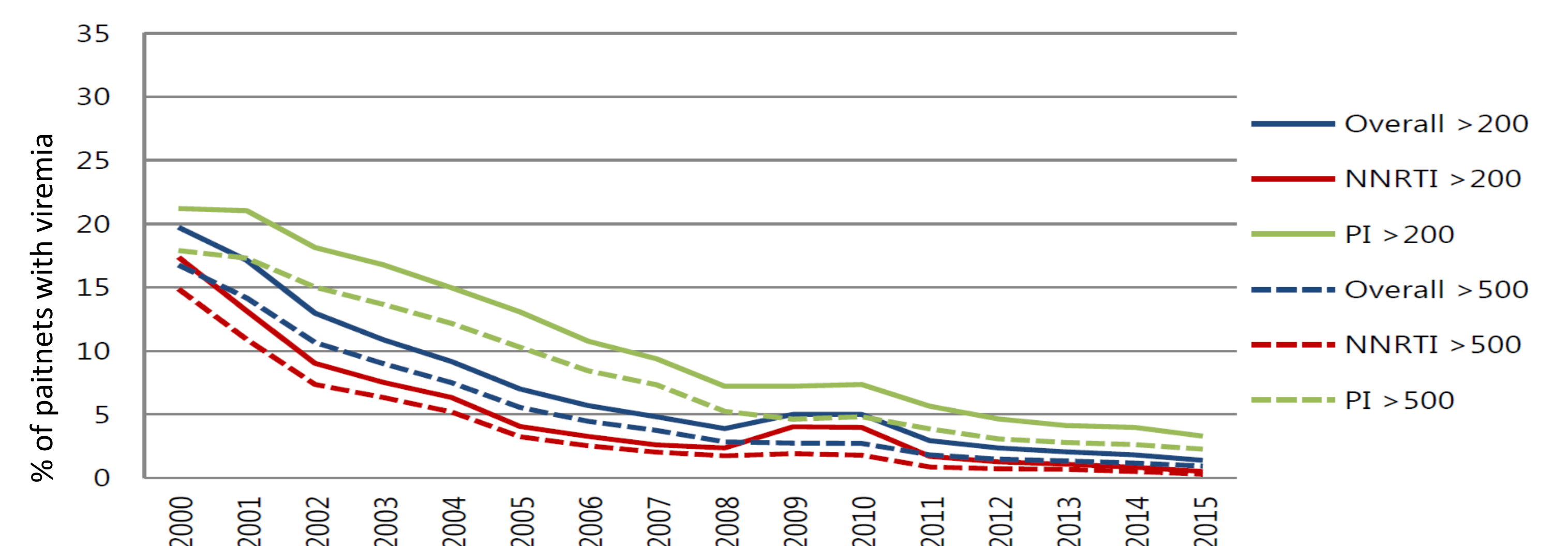


Table 1: Received cART regimens in 2017
