

Ukraine: the movement in the direction 90-90-90

THE PRIORITIZATION OF UKRAINE

19% PLWH in the EECA region
8% of the new HIV cases (EECA)
25% of deaths due to AIDS (EECA)

POSITIVE RESULTS IN UKRAINE

The HIV transmission from mother to child reduced by 7.5 times since 2001.

ART coverage increased by 20 times in the last 10 years

The increase of the ART from the state budget (01.01.2018)

State budget — 40 979,
GF — 22 839,
PEPFAR — 16 694 patients

The biggest ST programme in the region (9000 ST clients)

The increasing of state funding of the HIV and TB programmes in 140%

The access to the generic forms of the HIV/HEP C drugs

Significant price reduction for the essential HIV/HEP C drugs :
DOLUTEGRAVIR — from 200 USD to 5 USD,
LEDIPASVIR/SOFOSBUVIR (treatment course) from 43 215 USD to 900 USD

PROBLEMS AND CHALLENGES IN UKRAINE

The need to increase of the ART coverage from 85 025 (36%) to 192 780 (90%)

War (ATO area)

Reorganization of the public health system

The increase of the HIV incidence

2001 — 7 000 2016 — 17 066

55.6% (2016) HIV cases were detected on the 3rd and 4th clinical stages
