

Overview of HIV/AIDS situation in Uzbekistan

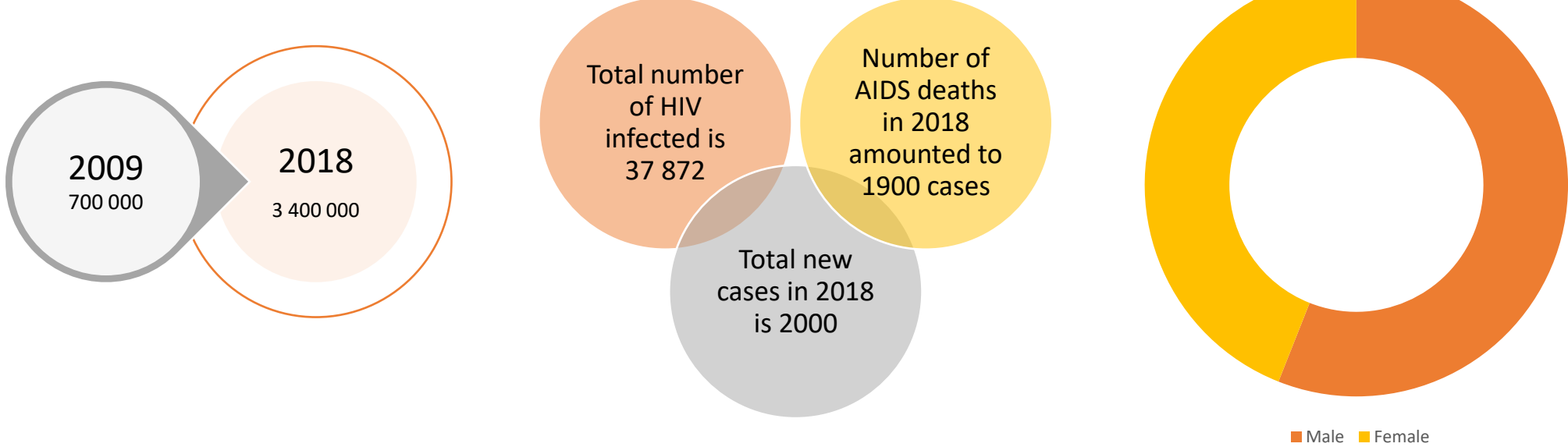
First case of HIV infection:

Population 32,768,725
HIV prevalence is 0.1%

Republic of Uzbekistan is a landlocked country in Central Asia. The sovereign state is a secular, unitary constitutional republic, comprising 12 provinces, one autonomous republic, and a capital city. Uzbekistan is bordered by five landlocked countries: Kazakhstan to the north; Kyrgyzstan to the northeast; Tajikistan to the southeast; Afghanistan to the south; and Turkmenistan to the southwest. Along with Liechtenstein, it is one of the world's only two doubly landlocked countries.

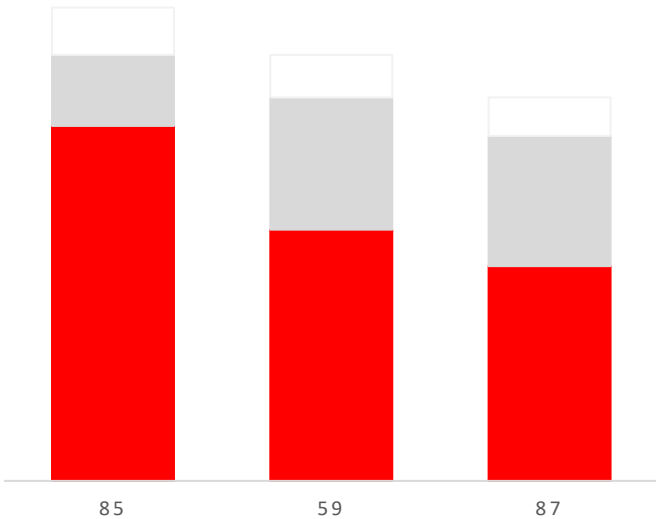


Access to HIV testing

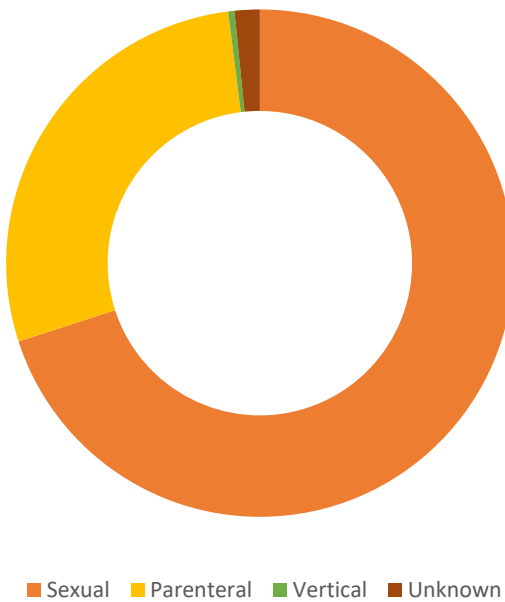


UNAIDS goals 90-90-90
